3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

1. Rice Cultivation

Our NSS Unit has adopted 1 village (Karipoor) in Nedumangadu and we have leased 2 acres of barren land for rice cultivation. This special programme was started with support of rally, farmers club, and *Nadeel Utsavam nattukuttam* etc. Around 240 NSS Volunteers undertook the special programme like “*Koithulsavam*” (sImbv̄ p-Ō-hw). We have successfully completed the Virippu season of paddy and harvesting ceremony was hosted by Shri. Palode Ravi MLA.

2. SahapadikkoruVeedu

Our NSS unit were constructed 2 NSS Bhavanams. (SahapadikkoruVeedu). One house cost Rs. 8,54,500/- and other cost of Rs. 2,65,000). The first house was donated to Kumari Athira and second one donated to Arunkumar. All the students and Faculty of our college donated generously for the project **House Maintenance/ Completion programme** named ***Koodukottaam Koottukark.***

2016. Sri.SajithBabu (NSS Regional Head), Sri.Palode Ravi (Deputy Speaker), PrakrithiyumJancy, Madhupal (cine Artist), Sri. Sabarinath MLA, Dr. VinuBhasker, P.S. Prasanth etc. participated and guided this programme.

3. National Seminar on Youth for Social Transformation

Organized two day National Seminar on the topic “Youth for social transformation” from 11th march 2016 to 12th march at College Auditorium. NSS Kerala Regional Head Sri.SajithBabu, IMK Professor and Head, Dr. B. Prakash, State Laison officer NSS, Dr. S. Venumohan, Co-ordinator NSS Kerala University, Dr. K. Chandrasekharan Nair, Annamalai University Professor. Dr. M. Shelvam, Kerala University Sociology Asst. Professor Dr. BusharaBeegam, Dr. Rahul, Dr. BaijuRamachandran, Kerala State Youth Welfare board chairman P. S. Prasanth etc. participated and delivered special papers on this seminar. 350 NSS Volunteers and 18 teachers participated in the Seminar.

4. Kallar Eco- Tourism Camp

Conducted environment protection camp at Kallar, Vithura. The camp was inaugurated by Sri. Sabarinath M. L. A (Aruvikkara Legislative Assembly). The programme includes trucking, awareness class, debate etc. Pledge was taken by NSS Volunteers for protecting environment.

5. Protection of “Ponnara Sreedhar Park”

NSS Unit of Govt. College, Nedumangadu and State Youth Welfare board jointly conducted an “Environment protection” Programme at Vizhinjam beach, Trivandrum on June 5th 2015. The programme was inaugurated Prof. Thonnakal Jamal (Syndicate Member, Kerala University) by planting a tree.

6. Vegetable Cultivation

We have cleared 2 acres of backyard in our college building and leveled the field, ploughed and prepare the seed bed. Seeds of amaranthus, ladysfinger chilly, brinjal, cowpea, tomato, snake gourd etc are sown.

7. Exhibition

A special Exhibition was conducted as a part of Yes -2016. The Topics like NSS and society, Traffic rules, First aids, Vegetable garden, A. P. J. Contributions, Communicable diseases, Environment protections etc were presented in this Exhibition. Around 1200 persons visited in this Exhibition.

8. Special Cleaning Programme

A team consists of 6 NSS Volunteers of our unit undertook a special cleaning programme in the Sabarimala associated with pollution control Board. 5 day special campaign was completed by our unit.

9. Plastic free campus

125 students participated in the plastic free campaign on 2nd December 2015. They collected plastics and handed over to Municipality Authority for recycling them.

10. Campus Cleaning

Our NSS unit celebrated one week for clean campus. Volunteers participated in the cleaning programme for one week on 2nd October 2015 onwards.

11. Eye – donation Awareness Campaign

Conducted eye donation awareness campaign with the help of Chaithanya Eye Hospital, Thiruvananthapuram. The programme officers along with volunteers visited each and every class and explained the importance of posthumous eye donation.

12. Distribution of Books and Study materials

We distributed books and all other study materials to the Students in the Govt. L. P. S. Arasuparambu.

13. Energy Conservation Programme

A Seminar on energy conservations was organized by the NSS units. The class was led by Dr. Binoy, the Head of Physics of Govt. Womens College, Thiruvananthapuram.

14. A. P. J Contribution

Our NSS unit organized a special programme regarding “continuation of A.P.J. Abdul Kalam. 10 Volunteers presented topics regarding the innovation of Mr. A.P. J. Abdul Kalam. The session was quite informative. Our beloved Principal inaugurated the session.

15. Charity - Donation

A programme conducted by NSS Volunteers for helping cancer patients in Nedumangadu. NSS Volunteers has donated Rs. 15000 /- for 3 cancer patients who are suffering cancer. Fund was collected through the “one rupee programme” conducted by the NSS Volunteers.

16. Kaiyethu Magazine-Mampoovu

The manuscript magazine was regulated during the year. About the students expressed their literacy and cultural outthrursts. The magazine was released by our principal.

17. NSS Help line

NSS Programme officers and selected volunteers have been working as a Learning camp to impart important information to all the students and the Public regarding career guidance. Higher Education, online admissions, PSC online applications, scholarships, Enrollment of Electoral roll etc.

18. Campus Cleaning and Installation of display board

As part of declaring Zero waste campus all the NSS volunteers participated in the cleaning programme of the campus on 06.07.2015, the waste materials were collected separately as bio-degradable and non-biodegradable and installed display boards bearing the writings “green Campus Clean Campus”, “Zero waste campus”, “Plastic Free Campus” etc at various places on the campus.

19. Blood Donation Camp

We have also conducted “Blood donation Camp” in that area against the Quarry exploitation in that area which is harmful to thousands of villagers. We are main organisers of “Environmental protection activities” in the Prakritheeyam.

23. Food packets- Distribution

24. E – governance programme

1. Title of the practice

Sahapadikkoru veedu

2. Goal

- i. Construct a home for a financially weak student
- ii. Spread the message of charity and service among students.

3. Context

Shri. Athira studying BA Malayalam was from poor economic background. She was the single daughter of her parents and her father was not with them. Her house was dilapidated and beyond repair. It is in this context our students under the leadership of NSS undertook the task of constructing home for Athira

4. The practise

Students and faculty of the college, with the help of philanthropists around Nedumangad raised more than 8 lakhs rupees for the construction of the house. NSS volunteers actively participated in the construction and fund raising. The completion of the project in time was a great achievement and inspired NSS to undertake similar projects in the subsequent years as well.

5. Evidence of Success

Sahapadikkoru Veedu by NSS Unit govt college Nedumangad brought the college fame, popularity and good will among the general public. This was one of the programmes that was instrumental in winning a number laurels to our college and the achievements of our NSS unit is recognised at university level, state level as well as at the national level.

6. Problems encountered and Resources required

Raising the required amount was Herculean task. The terrain of the proposed site was not that suited for easy construction and this escalated the budget. Additional resources needed to be mobilised and this was a huge challenge. The college authorities especially Dr R N ANZER, program officer NSS managed to garner support from Civil society, Political leadership and various other quarters to complete the project.

BEST PRACTICE - 2**1. Title :****Organic Farming and Vegetable Cultivation****2. Goal:**

- Create awareness about organic farming
- Bring back the culture of agriculture in students
- Effective use of extra time in the campus
- Create environmental consciousness

3. Context:

Kerala is traditionally known for its agriculture, paddy fields, vegetable cultivation and its climate. But the last decade witnessed a drastic change owing to many reasons. Paddy fields have disappeared, water level lowered, farmers are dwindling in number, forced to bring vegetables with pesticide content from outside the state. In this context it was imperative to make the students as well as the general public aware of the need and importance of agriculture and organic farming.

4. The practice:

Vegetables are cultivated in 2 acres land of the college campus. Bitter guard, Brinjal, Beans, Tapioca, Agasthya poovu, Papaya etc were cultivated and 2300 kilograms of vegetable produced. In Karipoor ela of Anad punchayath, under the initiative of NSS college unit leased out 3 acres of barren land and converted it into agricultural land with the help of local self government. Nadeel ulsavam(planting), and Koythulsavam (harvesting) are celebrated by our students as well as the local people. Around 3000 kgs of rice received till this season.

5. Evidence of Success:

The quantity of vegetables and rice received from the cultivation is the evidence of success of the programme. This programme brought out a thorough shift in the attitude of the students and they became more environmental conscious.

6. Problems encountered and Resources required:

Converting barren land to agricultural land and initial expense for cultivation were the biggest challenges. By ensuring the cooperation of local self government, department of agriculture and college PTA we managed to mobilised resources and funds
