

INITIATIVES TO ADDRESS LOCATIONAL ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES

Summary Report for the Academic Year 2018-19

1. Sharing of play Ground with Local Youth

College offers the facilities of playground to local youth for playing cricket, foot ball and other sports events before and after college time. This promotes the community-college interaction, chances of employability and sportsman spirit of the youth of the locality. College also provides facilities for cricket coaching by the District Cricket Association.

2. PSC Coaching.

Our college has sufficient staff support, infrastructure and resources to provide training and coaching for students as well as local community. Every year college provides PSC coaching classes to college students and local community to prepare them to face competitive exams. The classes are handled by the faculty of the college.

3. Centre for Examination for Outside Agencies

Government College Nedumangad offers infrastructure facilities and staff support for conducting various examinations by Kerala Public Service Commission over the years. Our college is located about 1.5 km from Nedumangad town which provides easy accessibility to candidates to reach the college as an examination venue. An average of 10 competitive examinations are conducted by the college every year for Kerala Public Service Commission. The college also serves as a centre for conducting examinations of the distance education candidates of University of Kerala.

4. ASAP Training centre for School Students

Our college is a skill development Centre of Additional Skill Acquisition Programme of Government of Kerala since 2012. College offers infrastructure facilities for conducting ASAP training to school students in and around Nedumangad Taluk. The classes are offered on Saturdays, Sundays and other holidays. In the academic year 2018-19 Four hundred students from 13 schools attend the fifteen courses offered by the institution

5. Centre for Continuing Education

In order to impart need based training to unemployed youth and to increase their employability, our college offers various courses under the scheme for continuing Education by Government of Kerala. The courses include Fire and Safety, Electrical and Plumbing, logistics, Fibre optical technology, and Computer hardware

6. Training for Faculty

During the year 2018-19 the College hosted two training programmes for Higher Secondary

Teachers (History) in collaboration with Kerala State Higher Education Council.

7. KSRTC daily Special Service to College

Even though the college is located around 1.5 km from the Nedumangad town, limited conveyance facility is available for students. After a mass representation from the college KSRTC has granted daily special service to College in the morning and evening to and fro between College and Nedumangad bus station .

8. Subsidised Food to College Community through College Canteen

Though the college is situated in a semi – urban area, most of the students are having rural background. Majority of the students belong to BPL category and they cannot afford food from outside food outlets at high rate. We have a good Canteen which provides food at subsidised rate . Canteen strictly follows green protocol in its functioning.

9. Online library

Since our college is located around 20 kms from the Trivandrum City, our students have limited access to resources as compared to students studying in city colleges. In order to address this issue we have inflienet facilities in the college from 2018 onwards which provides plenty of resources to staff and students at their finger tips.

10. Academic Collaboration with Institutions of Merit

In the year 2018-19, Department of Economics has signed memorandum of understanding with Centre for Development Studies (CDS), Thiruvananthapuram. Under this CDS enter into an agreement to mentor the Department of Economics to enable the faculty and students to further improve their knowledge and understanding of economic theory and its applications.
