2. Report on Campus Waste Management Problems

A three-day Nature Camp programme on ‘The Vital Importance of Conservation of Nature and Natural Resource’ at Pambadum Shola National Park, Vattavada, Munnar was conducted by Kerala Forest and Wildlife Department from 28 September to 30 September 2023 for a group of 34 students of Government College Nedumangad. Six faculty members accompanied the students. The camp aimed to bring an awareness about forest and wildlife in Munnar . Various informative and entertaining sessions were organised. Classes were handled by Dr.Rajkumar K.P., Mr.Gireesh, the Forest officers who were able to enlighten the students with their first hand experience. The second day started with a morning walk, “nature walk”. This was followed by a trekking through the evergreen forests of Pambadum Shola National park. The Shola forest consists of thick evergreen forests, dry grasslands and mountains. It was an enlightening camp for students which made them more aware about Nature.



4. Eco Restoration -29 September 2023

Nature club members actively participated in the Ecological Restoration project in Pattiyankal, Munnar. It is a process of repairing sites in nature and ecosystems which have been degraded or destroyed. Nature club members were willing to dedicate their time to the task. As we know it is our responsibility as humans to save our nature , the members of the Nature club put their efforts to identify the principles of ecosystem restoration. Restoration happens through actively planting or by removing pressures so that nature can recover on its own. It has been a great experience working for it, and the Nature Club members are eagerly looking forward to working for that project in future.



5. Panel Discussion 04 December 2023

A panel discussion on ‘Human-Wild life Conflict’ was conducted on 04 December 2024 . Human-Wildlife conflict is important because it causes direct material and economic damages to humans, crops, livestock and property. It was an open session that facilitates discussion among the moderator, speakers and the audience throughout the entirety of the panel. The panel, moderated by Christeena Ferdo Alex(I PCA,) has set the tone and pace and staying vigilant in keeping the discussion lively. The panelists were Vivek S.(II Mathematics), Architha A.S., Anjitha Biju B.S., Nandana Biju S.(II B.Com.,), Binsha B.S., Nikhila S.B.(I Economics), Sivani S.R.(I Mathematics) and Vineeth A.M.,Shijina Noushad(I B.Com.). The speakers emphasized the complex relationship between humans and wildlife, particularly in areas with higher elephant densities, and the importance of managing human-wildlife interactions rather than mitigating them. They discussed the significance of changing people’s perceptions and highlighted the role of society and media in highlighting the stories of coexistence. The speakers and the audience criticized the lack of a comprehensive policy or law of compensation in our country. It was a highly engaging session.


Heritage Walk



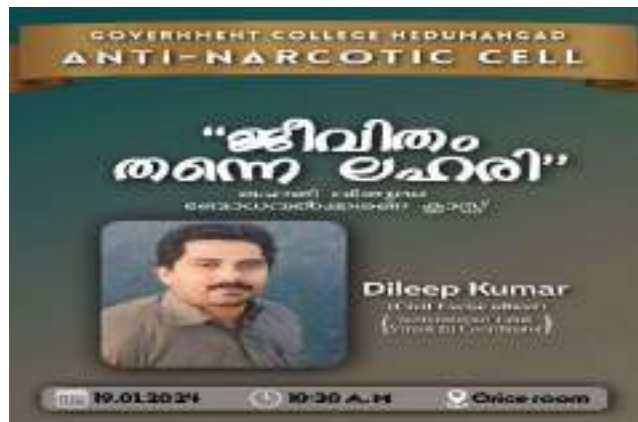




Anti-drug awareness class

As a part of community intervention programme, women Cell members of our college visited Thrippadam Old Age Home and Rehabilitation Centre. The programme was a great experience for our students.





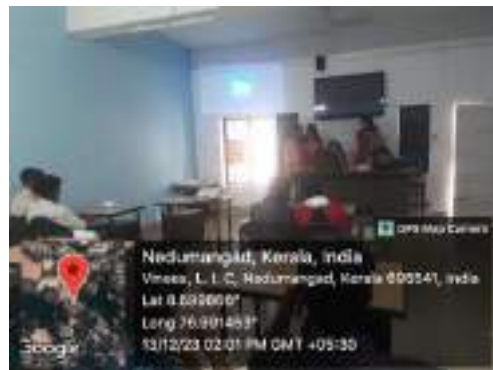

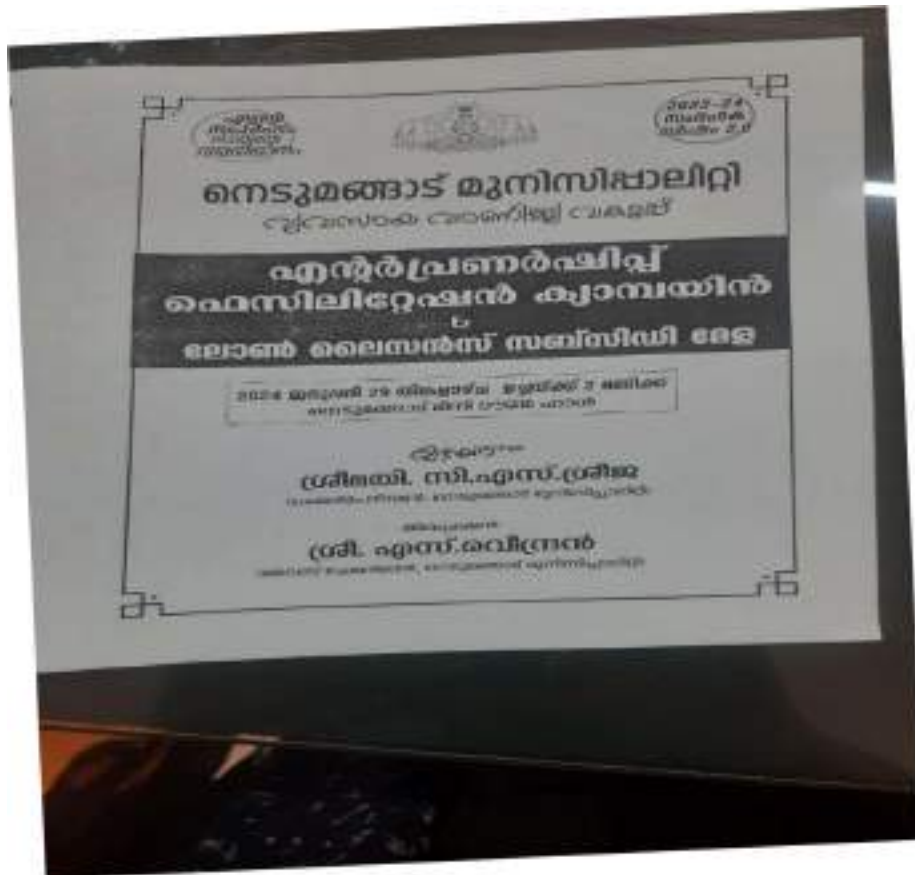

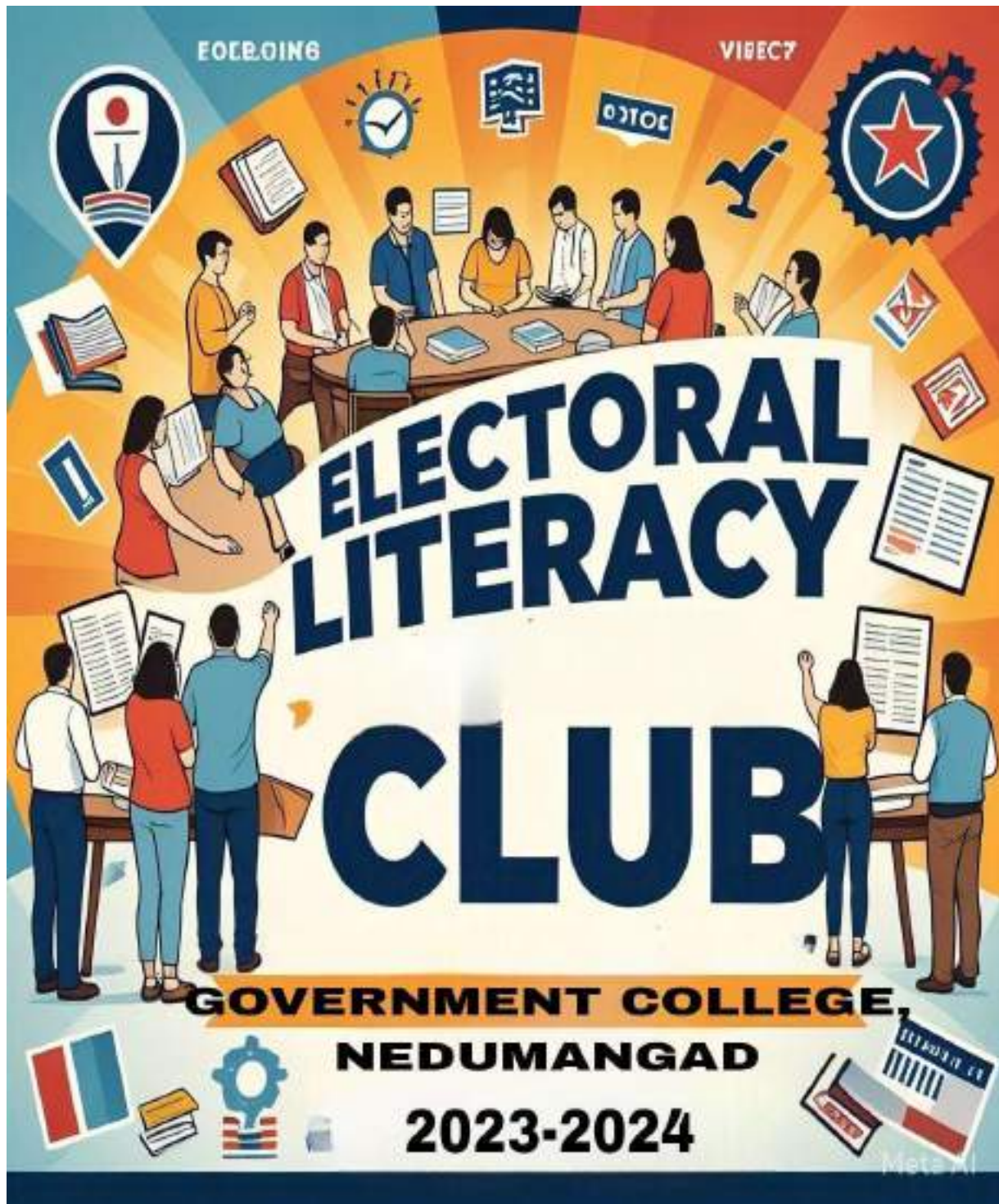

- To promote the importance of exercising one's right to vote.

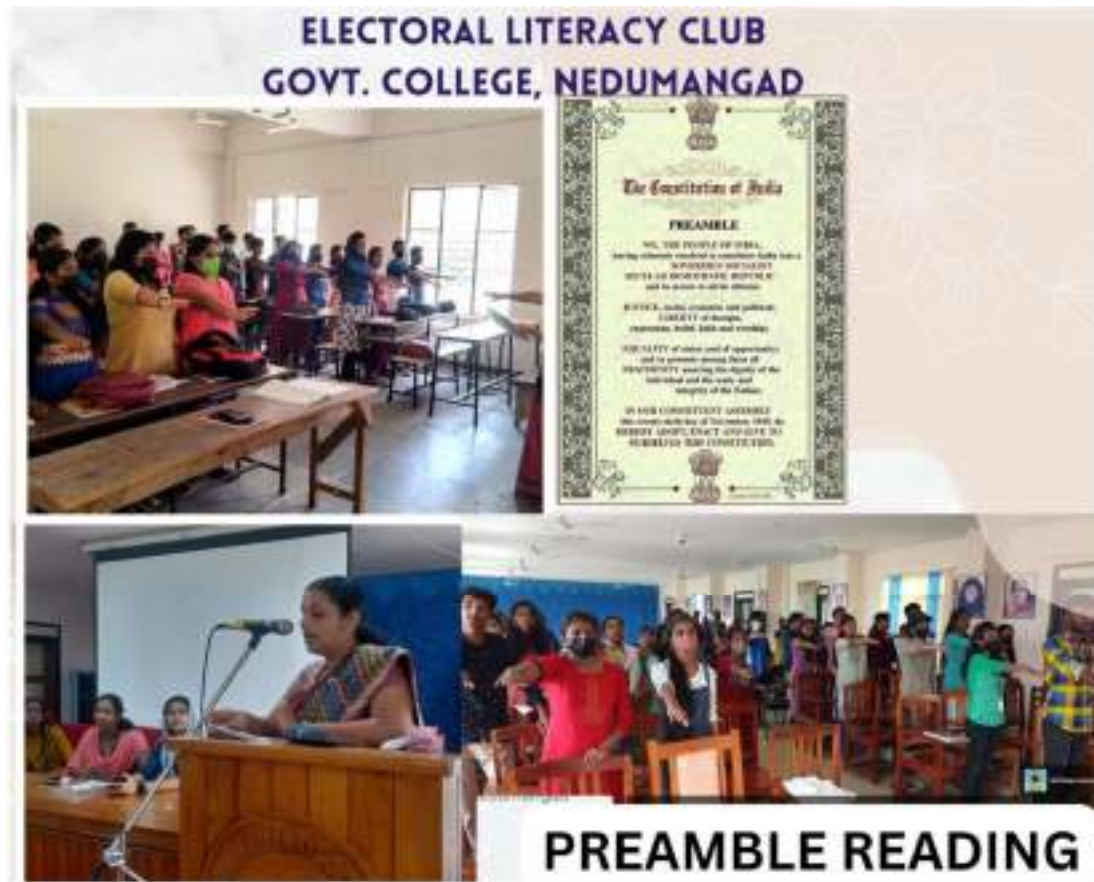
- To educate about the democratic process and its significance.

Participants were encouraged to creatively incorporate movie dialogues into their poster convey the message of exercising one's right to vote.



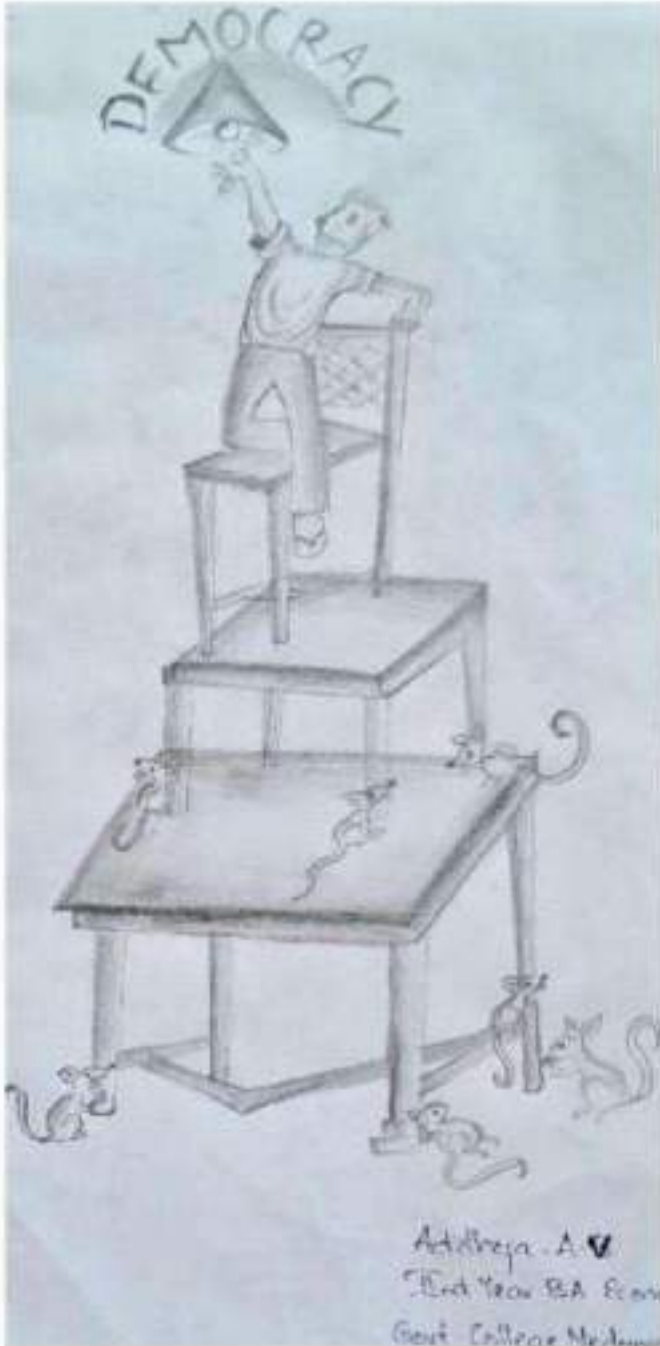
Cartoon Competition on Importance of Voting


